## **Report on Recent Meetings:**

### **March 14: Print Evaluation**

Melanie Morgan Shatto, a professional photographer in the South Bay, served as our evaluator for this entertaining and instructive program of print evaluation and comment. The turn-out was good and there were lots of prints. Thank you Melanie for a very enjoyable evening.

### **March 28: CSI Photography**

Allison Gipson and Craig Durling from the Torrance Police Department provided a fascinating program on how photography supports Crime Scene Investigation in the TPD. Allison is currently assigned to the CSI unit, and Craig spent some years as a photographer for the unit. The digital slide show presentation covered such topics as how the integrity of digital media is protected from tampering or alteration. The presentation also showed how the scope of CSI photography has expanded in recent years. The emphasis has shifted from solving the crime to providing answers to all possible questions that might arise in court. For example, photographic evidence might be called upon to prove that a witness could have seen the commission of the crime in spite of nearby bushes. The CSI photographer must anticipate the need for such photographic evidence and provide for it during early coverage of the crime scene. This presentation was of great interest to the large crowd attending. One hopes that we can have another such program in the future. Thank you Allison and Craig for such a marvelous evening.

This meeting was originally scheduled to be a showing of member-developed slide shows similar to what we had at the Holiday Banquet. However, so few slide shows were offered that the CSI program was substituted. Slide shows will be shown at the Awards Banquet in June.

### **March 11 - 13, Alabama Hills/Manzanar**

14 club members spent the weekend of Mar 11-13 photographing the Sierras, the rock formations, and the movie sites of the Alabama Hills just west of Lone Pine in the Owens Valley. Smaller groups split off to photograph wild flowers and the growing National Historic Site at Manzanar, a few miles north of Lone Pine. Some visited the movie museum in town. ## Entries Are Due April 11, 2011 (that is, in ONE week!) Don't forget.

1. STAIRS – Up, down, or around – stairs or steps.
2. BREAK-OUT – Photograph a breakout of some kind.
3. TRAINS/RAILROADS – Anything related to trains or railroads.
4. UMBRELLAS – Not only the kind you use on a rainy day but any kind.
5. SOMETHING THAT FLIES – Planes, birds, kites, bugs, etc.
6. NUMBERS – You find them everywhere: They're on road signs, buildings, vehicles, price tags, EVERYWHERE!
7. DOUBLE TAKE – Take a photo in which two similar subjects are captured at once.
8. BALLOONS – Balloons are fun and colorful....photograph one or more balloons for this category.
9. SOMETHING THAT NO LONGER WORKS – Photograph something that no longer works as it once did.
10. PUZZLE MACRO – Take a macro (close-up) photo of something, and try to stump the viewer as to what it actually is.
11. TRIPTYCH – A triptych is a work of art which is divided into three sections which are connected. Create an entry consisting of three panels that tells a story or illustrates a concept. Panels can be subdivisions of one photo or be constructed from up to three separate photos.
12. ZEN PHOTOGRAPH – Make an image that whispers serenity, simplicity, harmony. Make an image as silent as can be.
13. SELF PORTRAIT – not judged.
