Upcoming Meeting:

January 11, 2010, Digital Image Evaluation --- 1400 x 1050 pixels!!!

This meeting will be a regular evaluation program, but with a difference! Folks, the new club projector has arrived and will be available for showing our digital images. Since the new projector will have more resolution than the old projector, digital images should be prepared with more pixels than heretofore. You may now resample and size your digital images to a maximum of 1400 pixels in width and 1050 pixels in height. If your submitted image exceeds either of these limits, then the system software will do the reduction in size for you, but not always in the best manner. If your image has fewer pixels in either direction, then the projected image will be correspondingly smaller than full screen in that direction. Other than these new pixel guidelines, submit images in the regular manner through the club website.

There are several candidates for evaluator for this meeting, but the final selection has not been made.
