## **PROGRAM FOR OUR JUNE 12<sup>th</sup> MEETING:**

### **WILD PLACES OF THE AMERICAS**

Wild places still exist in the Americas, but they are not always easy to visit. In both North and South America, wild places are often in remote wilderness areas that require days of walking and camping to access. Even the approach can be challenging! My wife Rena Tishman and I are “budget travelers”, going without reservations, staying in simple guesthouses, and using local bus, train, and truck transportation. When the road finally ends, we put on backpacks or hire pack animals to reach our destination. The trips often take months, leaving lots of time for photographs, visiting with local people, and experiencing the natural beauty.

The locations of the photographs displayed range from Southern Chile to Arctic Canada. Being a climber, I have many opportunities to photograph mountains. In Patagonia, on the border between Chile and Argentina, Cerro Torre is one of the most beautiful mountains in the world and once was considered the most difficult to climb. Far away on Baffin Island, in Northern Canada, unique Mt. Asgard requires a 10-day backpack through glacial valleys to visit. But just as interesting are the many slot canyons found in Southern Utah, often requiring the same equipment to descend into them as climbers use to go high.

Besides taking photographs for almost 30 years, I engage in many outdoor activities, including climbing, river and sea kayaking, biking, backcountry skiing, and canyon hiking. Seldom do I go on a trip just for photography but I always have a camera with me. My activities provide a never-ending supply of interesting subject matter.

Many of the images were taken with an Olympus OM-1 mechanical camera with wide angle and telephoto lenses, although I have recently upgraded to a Canon 2000. A pocket-sized Olympus XA or equivalent is used when climbing or skiing. I do not plan to go digital. I shoot slides, use only a polarizing filter, and now use Fuji film, exclusively. The photos displayed are printed directly from the slides.

I hope you enjoy seeing my photographs as much as I enjoy taking them.
