Date	Program	Description/Background
Sep 8	Digital Image Evaluation	Our evaluator will be Taso Papadakis, returning to SBCC by popular request. The same entry rules as for prints apply. Enter your images through the club website by close-of-business on the Friday before the Monday meeting. Up to 3 entries. May be mono or color, new or repeat. Submit entries through the website. Maximum size is 764 pixels height and 1020 pixels width.
Sep 22	Portrait Retouching	Kelli MacDonald, who does this type of work professionally at Silvio's, is going to give us a program of theory and demonstration. You have to see this.
Oct 13	Print Evaluation	Our evaluator will be Annie Appel. Bring up to 3 prints, mono or color, mounted if possible. Maximum size of image/mounting is 16x20 inches so it will fit on the lighted easel. Bring photos you have shown before if you like, and hear what our insightful and delightful evaluator has to say.
Oct 27	Club Website Demo	President and Webmaster Phil Cohen will walk us through features of the website for the benefit of both newbies and oldies so we can all make better use of this resource. Don't miss this one!
Nov 10	Digital Image Evaluation	Our evaluator will be Joan Stolte, president of S4C (Southern California Council of Camera Clubs). Same rules as listed above for Sep 8.
Nov 24	Photographic Technique Presentation	Our presenter will be professional photographer Amy Cantrell, well known to SBCC members for her appearances as evaluator. The exact topic is being negotiated.

### August 11, Print Evaluation Night

### August 25, Table-top Macro Photography

An enthusiastic crowd of about 45 members and guests enjoyed a presentation by Don Gos, a local professional photographer who does commercial work, and also flowers, in particular, orchids. He is a founder of the South Bay Orchid Society. He talked about the color of lighting, and how to achieve various effects using inexpensive lighting and background equipment available from Home Depot or Loew's. ## SBCC Invited to Hold Photo Exhibition:

Our club has been invited by Paul's Photo to put on an exhibition of our photographs in the Gallery at the Paul's Photo store. This would be a one month exhibit held during early 2009, possibly as early as January. A total of 42 prints can be displayed. There will be an artists reception. The Board of Directors has given preliminary approval to the idea at the last meeting. The SBCC will be in charge of print selection and hanging. A theme will be selected soon, but whatever that theme may be, the emphasis will be on recent work --- only photographs made during 2008 or early 2009 may be exhibited. Entries may be color or black and white.

All prints must be framed behind glass, plexiglas or equivalent. All frames must have wire hangers with wire installed. All prints must be signed and titled on the mat or print. Minimum framed image size is 8x10" --- maximum framed image size is 16x20". Simple black frames with white mats are suggested. Printing must be high resolution --- 300 dpi or equivalent.

In order to hold an exhibition like this, we need someone to act as coordinator. We need someone to step up ASAP and accept this challenge. Let Phil know of your volunteering. If no one steps forward to coordinate, we will have to decline the offer from Paul's.

This is a great opportunity for some exposure (sic). I am looking forward to our participation.

- Phil was authorized to spend up to \$200 on needed equipment for the club digital projector. This is mainly for a bulb. Phil believes a new bulb can be obtained on E-Bay at that price. The bulb is needed to restore the rendering of true colors for our image evaluations.
- Gave informal approval to the idea of an SBCC exhibition at Paul's Photo.

The next Board Meeting will be held Monday, September 29, 7:30 PM, again at my home.
